

ETUC Congress facts & figures

496 voting delegates

204 non-voting delegates

From 90 national trade union organisations from 40 countries (as well as from 10 European trade union federations plus other trade union organisation)

1278 people participating in Congress

4 days of debate including

4 panels

3 'pillars' (of the Action programme, introduced and debated separately)

49 speakers (plus those who take the floor)

3 'official' fringe meetings

Votes on

- The ETUC Paris manifesto including on 16 amendments (from 19 trade unions)
- The Action Programme 2015-2019 'Stand up in solidarity for quality jobs, workers' rights and a fair society in Europe' including 67 amendments
- New President, General Secretary, 2 Deputy General Secretaries, 4 Confederal Secretaries, and 5 auditors – 13 votes
- Emergency resolutions? (deadline 6pm 30 Sept)

Interpretation into 15 languages

Live streaming in 5 languages (plus original language)

1789 – the original capacity of the historic Maison de Mutualité venue (a reference to the year of the French revolution)

33 – the number of exhibition stands
